



- ✓ Glass Enclosures: Choose tempered safety glass, typically 3/8" or 1/2" thick, for durability and safety. Consider clear glass for an open feel or frosted/textured glass for added privacy. Look for glass treated with a water-repellent coating to minimize water spots and simplify cleaning.
- ✓ Fixtures and Hardware: Choose high-quality, corrosion-resistant fixtures in a finish that comple-






