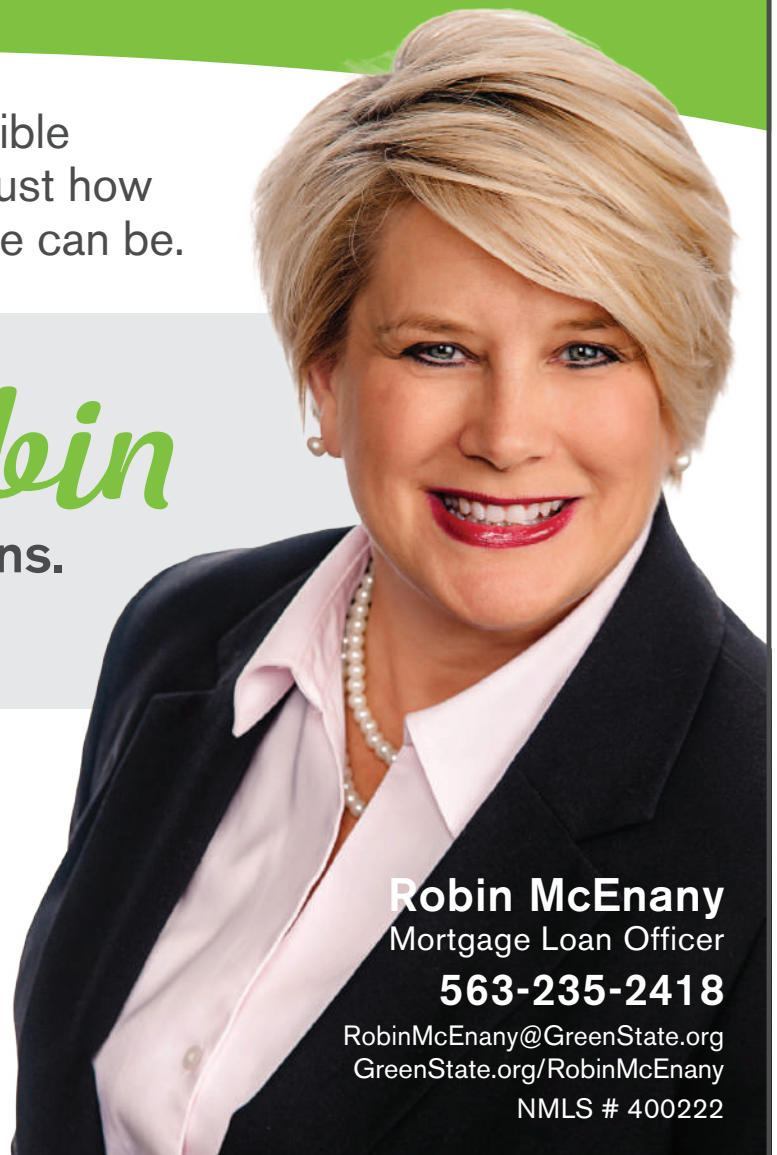

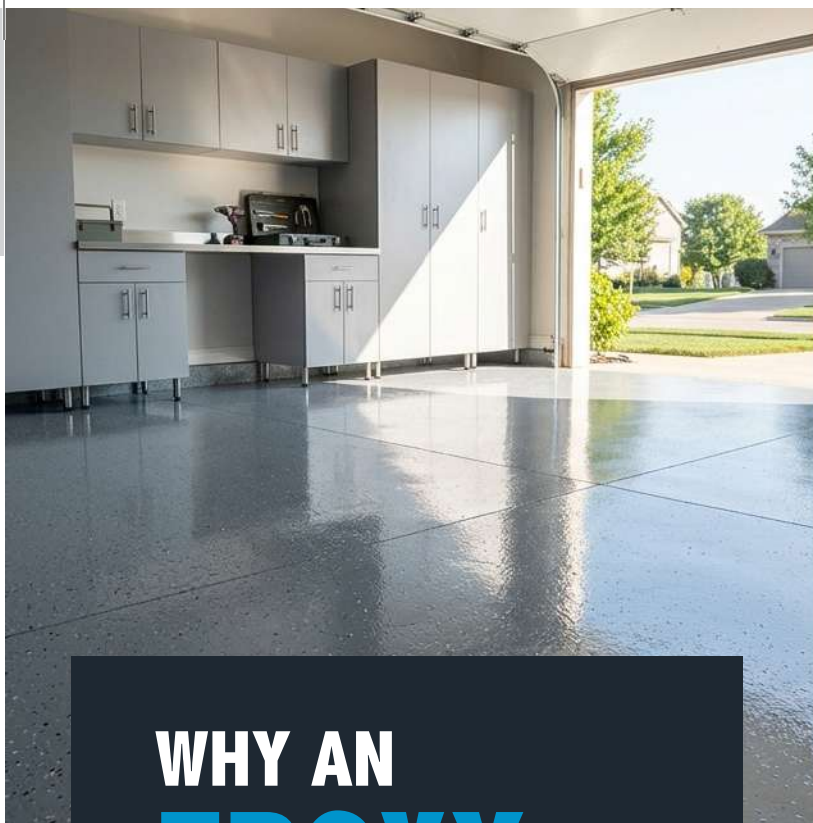

from entering the home. In some cases, blocking drafty vents with cut pieces of foam board insulation or replacing seals will suffice to address leaks.

A programmable thermostat helps to regulate temperatures based on daily routines, so homeowners aren't heating homes while no one is there to appreciate it. Experts can ensure electrical installation is done safely and provide guidance selecting a model that is appropriate for managing a home's heating and cooling needs.

REPLACE WEATHER STRIPPING AND SEAL TRIM

Over time and with frequent use, weather stripping breaks down and loses its shape, and can even become brittle. Cracked trim around doors and windows leads to air leaks, and sometimes homeowners think the only solution is replacing windows and doors, but they still end up with drafts. Contractors can periodically replace trim using foam sealant to help eliminate inevitable drafts and save homeowners money in the long run – a more cost-effective approach than paying for new windows and doors.

PREVENT ICE DAMS

Snow-covered roofs and freezing weather can lead to ice dams – thick ridges of solid ice that build up in gutters and along eaves. Dams can damage gutters and shingles and cause water to back up, which could force the water inside where it can peel paint, warp floors and lead to stained or sagging ceilings. To prevent damming, have a professional clear your gutters of leaves and debris ahead of the first snow and consider installing gutter guards to help prevent melting snow from refreezing in gutters.

-  **YELLOW:** Gas, Oil, Petroleum, Gaseous Materials, or Steam
-  **ORANGE:** Communication, Cable TV, Alarm, or Signal Lines
-  **BLUE:** Potable Water Lines
-  **GREEN:** Sewers and Drain Lines

ELECTRICITY IS A NECESSARY EXPENSE

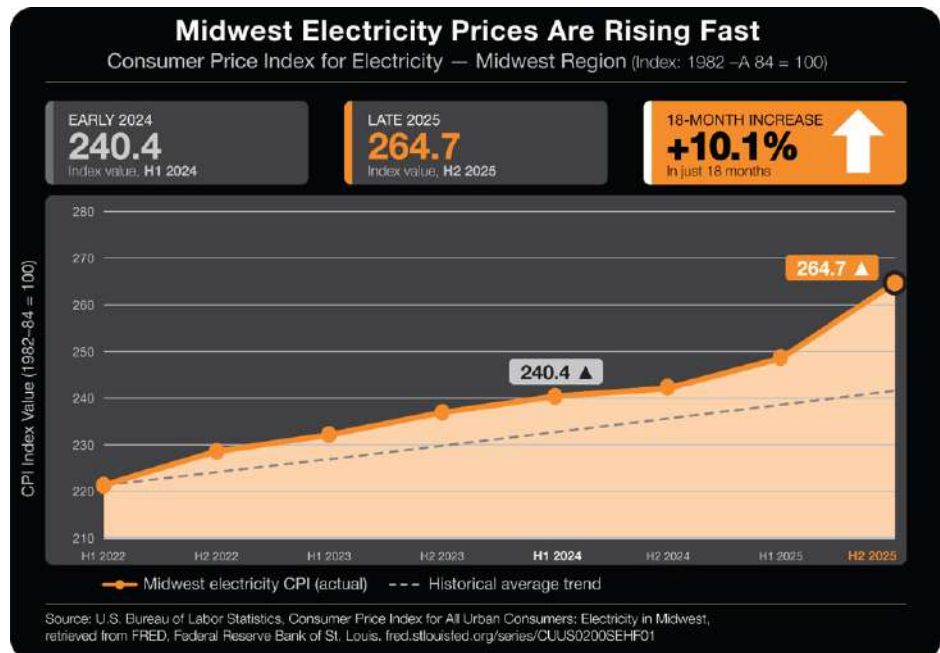
& Power Bills Keep Going Up

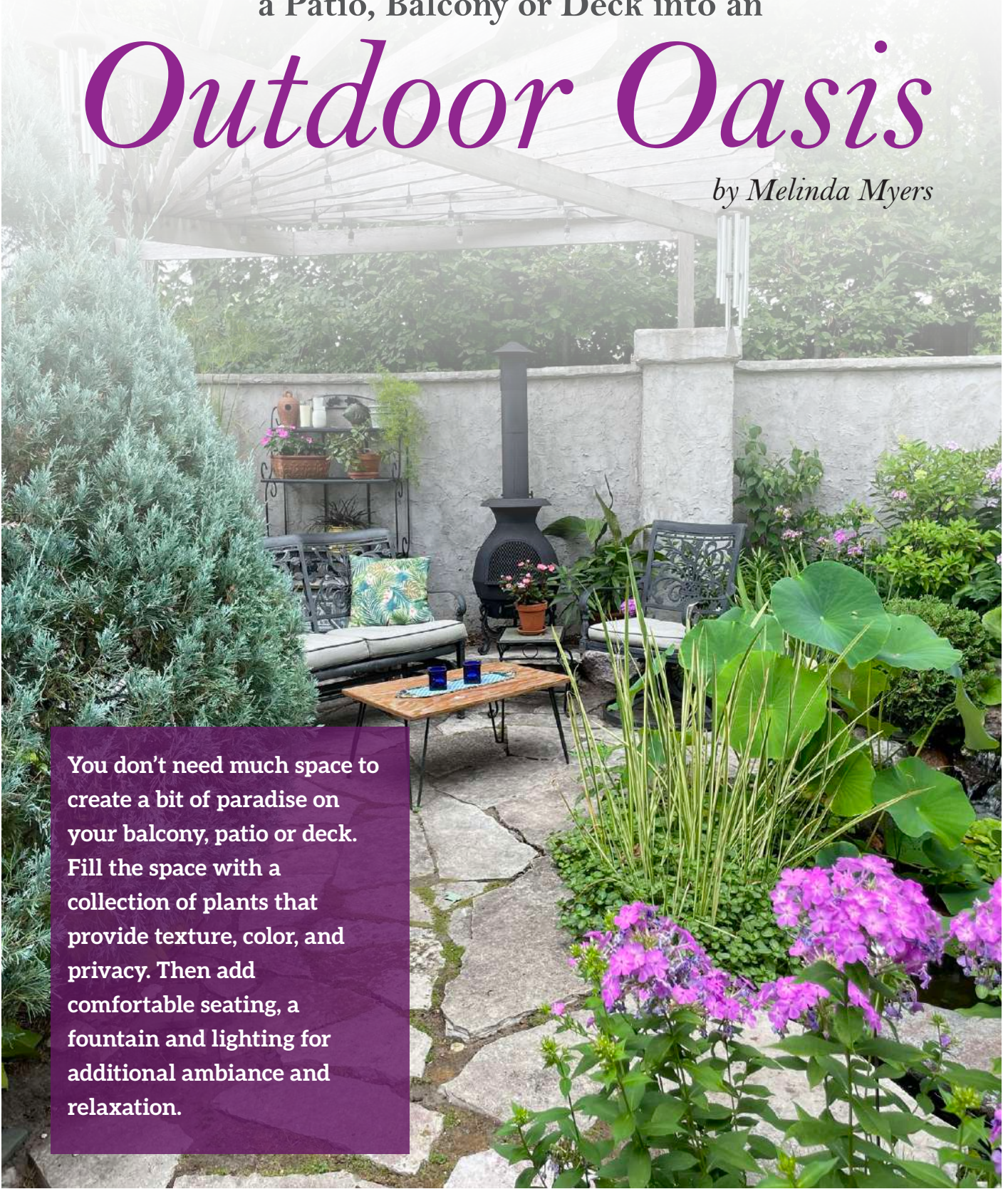
over the lifetime of the panels.

How to Transform a Patio, Balcony or Deck into an *Outdoor Oasis*

You don't need much space to create a bit of paradise on your balcony, patio or deck. Fill the space with a collection of plants that provide texture, color, and privacy. Then add comfortable seating, a fountain and lighting for additional ambiance and relaxation.

Start by evaluating the space you want to transform and how the surrounding views and noise will impact your enjoyment. Before enclosing the entire space, identify the views you need to screen and those you want to keep. Perhaps a view of your favorite flower garden, the park across the street or your neighbor's water feature extends your enjoyment beyond the limits of your garden oasis.

Use tall grasses, large tropical plants, and vines trained on trellises and upright shrubs and trees to define the space. These can be grown in weather-proof containers if no in-ground planting space is available. Just make sure your balcony or deck can handle the weight of the planters once they are filled with soil and plants.

Select plants that provide multiple benefits. Look for plants that deliver several seasons of beauty with flowers, colorful foliage, seedheads and fall color. Include fragrant plants for aromatherapy and those that attract butterflies and hummingbirds to add motion and color.

Decide how you plan to use the space. Are you longing for a quiet area to relax and read, one to entertain or a space to accommodate all your outdoor activities? Select furnishings with the color, form, and style that will create your desired look and feel. Then select plants, containers and accessories that complement the furnishings for your outdoor oasis.

Add a stand-alone or wall-mounted fountain or container water garden to the space. The sound of moving water helps create a sense of peace and relaxation, calming the mind, reviving the spirit and masking noise pollution.

Help reduce mosquito problems by lighting a few citronella candles and placing them near you and others enjoying the space. Use a fan to help keep you cool and the weak-flying mosquitoes away.

Extend your enjoyment into the evening with some lighting. Be mindful of birds and night-flying insects by using shields to point light down to the ground instead of into the night sky. Select lights with lower lumens

that aren't as bright but still provide sufficient light and ambiance for you. Avoid white and blue light and opt for amber and yellow greens that are less disruptive to the birds and night-flying pollinators.

Like any decorating or gardening project, be ready to make needed adjustments.

While fine-tuning your design, be sure to take time to relax and enjoy your new space.

A GUIDE TO CHOOSING A RELIABLE APPLIANCE REPAIR SERVICE



When a major appliance breaks down, it disrupts the entire rhythm of a household. Whether it's a refrigerator that's stopped cooling or a washing machine that won't drain, the urge to find a quick fix can sometimes lead to hasty decisions. Choosing the right repair company is essential to ensure the job is done safely, correctly, and at a fair price.

Here is a guide to navigating the process of finding a professional you can trust.

START WITH RESEARCH AND REVIEWS

The internet is the modern-day word-of-mouth. Start by looking for companies in your local area with high ratings, but don't just look at the star count.

Read the Narrative: Look for reviews that mention punctuality, transparency in pricing, and whether the technician explained the issue clearly.

Check Verified Platforms: Sites like the Better Business Bureau (BBB), Angi, or Google Business Profiles provide a good baseline for a company's reputation.

Ask Your Network: Often, a neighbor or a friend has recently dealt with a similar headache. Personal recommendations are frequently the most reliable.

VERIFY CREDENTIALS AND INSURANCE

Appliances are complex and often involve high-voltage electricity, gas lines, or water connections. You want a professional who is properly covered.

Licensing: Ensure the company holds the necessary trade licenses required by your state or municipality.

Insurance: A reputable company should carry general liability insurance and workers' compensation. This protects you from being held liable if a technician is injured on your property or if the repair causes further damage.

Manufacturer Certification: If you have a high-end or specialized brand, look for "factory-authorized" service providers. These technicians have received specific training from the manufacturer and have better access to OEM (Original Equipment Manufacturer) parts.

TRANSPARENCY IN PRICING

A common red flag is a company that refuses to give any indication of cost over the phone. While a technician usually needs to see the machine to provide a definitive quote, the company should be clear about:

The Service Fee: This is the "trip charge" for coming to your home and diagnosing the problem. Ask if this fee is waived if you decide to proceed with the repair.

Labor vs. Parts: Ask how they bill for labor (flat rate vs. hourly) and if they

provide a written estimate before starting the work.

EVALUATE THE WARRANTY

A confident repair service stands behind its work. Always ask about the warranty on both parts and labor. A standard warranty is typically 90 days, but some top-tier companies offer up to a year on specific parts. Be wary of any company that offers no guarantee once they leave your driveway.

COMMUNICATION AND PROFESSIONALISM

From the first phone call, pay attention to the level of professionalism.

- Do they answer the phone promptly?
- Are they able to provide a specific window for the appointment?
- Does the technician arrive in a marked vehicle or uniform?

These details often reflect the organized nature of the business and the level of care they will take with your appliances.

QUICK TIP

Before you call for service, have your appliance's brand, model number, and serial number ready. This allows the company to check for known issues or part availability before they even arrive.

By taking a few extra minutes to vet your options, you can turn a stressful home maintenance moment into a smooth, professional experience.

HOW TO USE TILE TO MAKE SMALL SPACES FEEL BIG

We can't change the square footage of a cramped powder room, a narrow entryway, or a compact galley kitchen without knocking down walls. But you don't always need a sledgehammer to make a room feel bigger. Sometimes, all you need is a clever visual trick.

Tile is one of the most powerful tools in an interior designer's toolkit for manipulating depth, height, and width. By changing how light bounces and where the eye stops, the right tile selection can make a tight space feel larger and more open.

Here are four design secrets that will help turn a small room into a visually expansive retreat.

1 Go Big with Large-Format Tiles

The most common mistake people make in small spaces is assuming they need small tiles. The logic feels sound: small room, small elements. But the opposite is true.

When you use small tiles—like standard subway tiles or small

squares—you create a dense grid of grout lines. Every single grout line is a visual stop sign for your brain. A busy grid makes a room feel chopped up, cluttered, and ultimately smaller. By choosing large-format tiles (usually 12"x24" or larger), you drastically reduce the number of grout lines. The floor or wall becomes a single, continuous plane.

Pro Tip: To maximize this effect, match your grout color perfectly to your tile. When the grout blends in completely, the boundaries disappear, and the surface looks seamless.

2 Erase the Floor-to-Shower Boundary

If you are remodeling a small bathroom, this single trick will completely transform the space. Traditionally, bathrooms are broken into zones: a floor tile, a different shower pan tile, and a third tile for the shower walls. This constant stopping and starting cuts the room into tiny fragments.

Instead, run your floor tile straight through into the walk-in shower. Using a single, uninterrupted material across the entire floor plane tricks the eye into thinking the bathroom footprint is much wider than it is. Combine this with a seamless glass shower panel rather than a bulky framed door or a curtain, and the back wall of your shower suddenly becomes the new visual boundary of the entire room.

3 Direct the Eye with Smart Layout Patterns

The way you lay your tile acts as a set of directional arrows for anyone walking into the room. You can use these patterns to elongate or widen a space depending on what it needs.

- For narrow galley kitchens or entryways: Lay rectangular tiles perpendicular to the long walls (running across the width of the room). This draws the eye side-to-side, visually stretching the narrowest part of the space.

- For short, stubby rooms: Lay rectangular tiles parallel to the long walls to draw the eye forward, giving the illusion of depth.
- The Diagonal Trick: Laying square tiles on a 45-degree angle (a diamond pattern) is an incredible spatial hack. Because the human eye counts squares easily but struggles to calculate the distance of diagonals across a room, a diamond pattern confuses our depth perception in the best way possible, making the floor feel much wider.

Running the long edge of the tile up and down draws the human eye upward toward the ceiling. If you run this vertical tile all the way from the floor up to the ceiling, you accentuate the full height of the space, making the room feel grander and less boxed-in.

Light and Sheen: The Finishing Touch

Beyond size and layout, keep finish and color in mind. Reflective surfaces act like mirrors, bouncing light around a cramped room.

While matte tiles have a beautiful, earthy texture, a gloss or satin finish tile will capture natural or ambient light and reflect it back into the space, instantly brightening dark corners. Keep the colors light and airy—soft creams, crisp whites, cool grays, or gentle pastels. Light colors recede from the eye, whereas dark, heavy colors advance toward you.

By choosing large tiles, minimizing contrast, and laying them with a purpose, you can stop fighting your home's footprint and start outsmarting it.

4 Harness Vertical Lines to Lift the Ceiling

If your issue isn't width but a low, claustrophobic ceiling, you can use wall tile to create height.

Take a classic rectangular tile—like a modern elongated subway tile—and vertically stack them on the wall instead of laying them in the traditional brick joint pattern.
